What is the MAP Program?

The MAP Program is a tutoring program designed to help students develop study skills and test readi-

ers. They must also have completed the class in which they are helping.

When a student requests help, he or she will be paired with a tutor. Since students have needs in different areas, the tutor they receive will have

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How do I get Set Up?

To ensure our students are getting the best assistance, we require our tutors/mentors to:

- Maintain a 3.5 GPA or higher
- Work well with others
- Be capable and dedicated
